Program Purpose

Boys State is a practical application of the duties, responsibilities and privileges of American Citizenship. Its purpose is to awaken within the youth of our Nation a sincere conviction that a well-informed, intelligent, participating citizenry is most vitally needed to protect and preserve our American traditions. Boys State is strictly non-partisan, and representatives of both major parties are invited and represented throughout the week. In addition, students are encouraged to share their own views on the issues.

The American Legion New Hampshire Boys State is a six-day training course in study and practical application of self-government. It is not meant to take the place of a course in Civics or Government as taught in high schools of the state, but is planned so students may put into practice the theories of American government as taught in the classroom, through operation of the city, town and state offices as organized under the plans of Boys State.

American citizenship is a priceless possession. America is a free land, and believing that principles of democracy as guaranteed by our Constitution have made us a great and powerful nation. The American Legion hopes to assure this freedom to our citizens of future generations. In order to accomplish this purpose, youth must be trained not only in theory of Government, but in its actual practice and operation. We believe that a prepared and trained youth will more effectively preserve and perpetuate this precious heritage and be ready to assume the trust and responsibilities that go with American citizenship.

Academic Evaluation & Scholarship Opportunities

All participants will be tested at the conclusion of the program to evaluate the quality of the material presented and the effectiveness of the program. All students will be eligible to apply for The American Legion New Hampshire Boys State scholarships of up to \$1,000.00 each. Each year, The American Legion and the Sons of The American Legion award up to \$7,000.00 in scholarships to Boys State students.

Program Methodology/Philosophy

"LEARN BY DOING" - When the students arrive on campus, they will be assigned to a city or town, to the model House or Senate, to an Executive Council District, and to a mythical political party. Conduct of the program will function under the basic laws of the State of New Hampshire, using the existing constitution and existing laws as a guide.

The caucus and convention method will be used for nominating candidates to city and town offices. Primary elections will determine the party's nominees for state offices. There are many opportunities to serve in an elective or appointed office at Boys State. The petition method is used in determining how a candidate's name is placed on the ballot. Mock municipal meetings, political party meetings and a court trial will be held.

The citizens of Boys State have their own legislature, introduce and argue their own bills and conduct their own elections. Each student has a chance to learn for himself that Government is just what he makes it. Staff members are not participants, and will not promote their own views during these sessions.

Health/Medical

Delegates to Boys State will be protected by a supplementary group health and accident policy. This policy is NOT intended to replace any primary coverage already carried by the boy or his parents; it is additional coverage. Every care will be taken to avoid accidents or illness, but Boys State will not be responsible for either injuries or sickness should they occur. Each boy must bring with him on the first day of the program a medical certificate (form enclosed), showing that he has been examined by a medical practitioner and is in good health.

Staff

Administrators and Counselors are trained and experienced leaders of young men, each of whom has passed a background check and completed appropriate training. Experienced counselors of excellent character and an ability to deal with young men are selected for staff. All are Boys State Graduates. Junior counselors are recent Boys State Graduates who have shown maturity and an interest in the purposes of Boys State. Instructors and lecturers will be some of the most outstanding personalities available.

Visitors

Members of The American Legion, School Officials, Sponsors, and Parents are invited and urged to visit Boys State at some time during the session. Visitors are requested to make their presence known to a

staff member upon arrival. Visitors are especially invited to the graduation ceremonies on the final day of the session.

Fees

The only fee charged to any student who wishes to attend is a \$25.00 non-refundable application fee.

The entire balance of the tuition (\$360) is paid on behalf of the student by a New Hampshire American Legion post, an individual, a local business, or some other local organization. Together, these fees cover the entire cost of room, board, costs of instruction, recreation, and expenses incidental to Boys State. The sole exceptions are transportation to and from Saint Anselm College and personal expenses, which are the student's responsibility.

Checks should be made payable to THE AMERICAN LEGION – DEPARTMENT OF NH and transmitted to Department Headquarters together with properly-completed application and draft bill forms.

Section 2

Selection Criteria

Selection and sponsorship of one or more candidates from the Junior or Senior Classes should be made in cooperation with the local American Legion Post. **We encourage high schools to nominate multiple eligible students.** Final approval remains with the Legion Post. In the case of Regional or Cooperative Schools covering more than one town, candidates should be selected for the approval of The American Legion Post officials in each town. If unsure who to contact, please call (603) 856-8951 or refer to the American Legion website for a listing of local posts in the state: www.legionnh.org.

Eligibility

Boys who will have completed either their JUNIOR or SENIOR year in School Year 2020-2021 and will be accepted if they meet the following criteria:

- Scholastic average should be 80 or better.
- Must be of good character and health.
- Should have outstanding qualities of leadership, character and good citizenship.
- Submit draft bill or resolution with application (see enclosed instructions).
- Homeschool students may attend, provided they meet eligibility requirements.

Note 1: Our program is fun, but requires good participation and attention. Students must pass an examination to graduate from the program, so students attending will be expected to handle the academic nature of the program as well.

Note 2: There is **NO LIMIT** to the number of qualified students that a school may send. In the event that the Legion post you are working with has difficulty supporting multiple candidates, please contact Department Headquarters and we will work with you to support your applicants. In the past, we have accommodated as many as 10 students from the same school, and it is common for large schools to send 4-6 students. So long as they are qualified, they will be welcomed.

Note 3: Post Commanders and High School Principals: In making final selections, please pick the boys who are the leaders. By selecting the best available students, a high quality program is maintained and the consensus is not that anyone can attend Boys State. It should be an HONOR to attend Boys State as the representative of your school and community.

Application Deadline

All applications must be received at Department Headquarters by **May 26, 2023**. Post officials are reminded that the Post's tuition payment of \$360.00 as well as the student's nonrefundable application

fee of \$25.00 must accompany each application. Checks should be made payable to THE AMERICAN LEGION – DEPARTMENT OF NH.

Post Program Follow-Up

At the conclusion of Boys State, each boy attending will be expected to fulfill his obligation to report to his sponsor telling of his impression of Boys State.

Scholarships

A number of scholarships are offered this year. In a typical year, approximately 10% of program attendees receive scholarships. This includes a student selected for Samsung Scholarship of \$1,000.00, who is automatically eligible to be selected for a further national scholarship of \$10,000. Please note that program regulations limit eligibility to compete for the Samsung Scholarship to members of the Junior Class only.
